Pupil Premium Plan 2019-20

In 2019-20, Brown Clee has 16% of its' pupils eligible for Pupil Premium Funding; 2% of these are Forces Pupil Premium children.

Current Allocation:

In 2019-20 Brown Clee Primary School will receive **£18,470** in Pupil Premium.

Main Barriers to Educational Achievement:

- Low levels of parental engagement with their child's learning.
- Low levels of oracy
- High percentage of SEND pupils for a small school.

Allocation Spend to Address Barriers:

- Additional teaching assistant hours to provide 1:1 or small group support to close the gaps with peers and provide same day intervention, particularly for SEND pupils.
- Additional Speech and Language provision including Teaching Assistant support.
- CPD for staff to enhance pupils self-esteem/meta-cognition/self-regulation
- Subsidising enhancement activities such as residential and educational visits.
- Purchasing of resources to support parental support of homework to improve outcomes for pupils.

*33% of the year group are eligible for Pupil Premium (PP). 1 pupil joined us at the beginning of Year 6, and had previously been taught in a Welsh school so on a different curriculum.

*The attainment of the pupils eligible for FSM6 is in-line with those within the LA for reading and GPS but slightly lower for maths. The new arrival significantly affected our outcomes for FSM6.

* The performance of 'Other' pupils is significantly above the outcomes for the LA.

EYFS

* 4 children (36% of the cohort) was identified as eligible for Free School Meals.

* 75% achieved GLD, and 1 pupil achieved the Exceeding standard across all areas.

* The group of children eligible for Pupil Premium funding is 17% of the year group but the overall numbers are so small that this group is statistically insignificant.

* Within this cohort, there is a high % of SEND.

How has the use of Pupil Premium benefitted pupils who are not eligible for funding:

* The extra TA hours (some outside of the working day) are often used for small group or paired work, so non-Pupil Premium pupils benefit from extra support.

* The expenditure on CPD benefits all pupils.
