Pupil Premium Plan 2020-21

In 2020-21, Brown Clee has 9% of its' pupils eligible for Pupil Premium Funding; 2% of these are Forces Pupil Premium children.

Current Allocation:

In 2020-21 Brown Clee Primary School will receive **£18,570** in Pupil Premium (this includes funding for children who have been on FSM in the past 6 years and are still in attendance).

Main Barriers to Educational Achievement:

- Low levels of parental engagement with their child's learning, particularly during Lockdown.
- Low levels of oracy
- High percentage of SEND pupils for a small school.

Allocation Spend to Address Barriers:

- Additional teaching assistant hours to provide 1:1 or small group support to close the gaps with peers and provide same day intervention, particularly for SEND pupils.
- Additional Speech and Language provision including Teaching Assistant support.
- CPD for staff to enhance pupils self-esteem/meta-cognition/self-regulation
- Purchasing of resources to support parental support of homework to improve outcomes for pupils.
