Dear Parents,

New School Year – Wednesday 2nd September

I hope that you have had a good summer, and are looking forwards to all being back at school next Wednesday! The staff have been working really hard to get the school ready, and it is all looking well organised and prepared to welcome all the children back after such a long time.

I am very aware that the school is going to look and feel very different - to children and also to parents - as we can no longer welcome parents into the school building (including the reception area) and for parents of KS2 children, we won't really see you at all, as you will be dropping your children off and collecting from the top gate. This is very sad as part of what makes Brown Clee so special, is the strong sense of team and the welcoming friendly environment, but in the current situation we have to put safety and protection first.

Therefore I have attached the Start and End of Day Procedures again for reference - as these are so important to get right. The start and end of the school day are when we have the highest concentration of people together - so the highest risk of spreading the virus. Therefore I kindly ask that you please note the time and route that your child/children need to take to access and leave school - as punctuality is going to be really important. I also ask that you maintain a 2m socially distanced space between other parents/carers, on drop off and collection.

We have worked really hard to ensure we keep the class bubbles apart - and this is all to minimise the impact of we were to have a case in school. If we do not maintain securely distinct bubbles, or we don't maintain the 2m between adults, then, as well as increasing the risk of spreading the virus within the community and potentially infecting vulnerable people, we would also risk a potential school closure - which we really don't want to happen.

I also kindly ask that if any child is displaying any coronavirus type symptoms, that they are kept off school, and that a coronavirus test is taken. We do have the virus within the community, and there are a number of children who are self-isolating on advice of Track and Trace - so we need to be particularly vigilant.

I feel very sad that this is not the 'normal' welcome back email - but I am confident that we will all soon get used to the new routines and procedures, and as such we will be able to provide the children with a safe and happy environment within which they can continue to learn and flourish!

Enjoy the rest of the break and we look forwards to seeing everyone on Wednesday 2nd September!
