We received 10 responses, so each response = 10%.

## Comments

*Parking and car movements are problematic, lots of vehicles moving around, no car parking so chaotic and dangerous at drop off and pick up. Turn the island into car parking.*

- We appreciate that drop off and collection are busy times of the day, and this is a timely reminder to all parents of the importance of considerate parking, and slow, steady driving on the school grounds. We appreciate that with the building work there is no on-site parking, but have noticed that more parents are using the 'drop and go' approach in the morning drop-offs, which works well. With regards removing the island and turning it into car parking, this was discussed, but it was felt that this could cause more risks as there would be no segregation of traffic and there could be confusion as to which direction to drive in.

*The GP room window was damaged over the summer holidays and was unlikely to be from natural causes.*

- This did happen and the window was quickly repaired. There was an investigation but no sign of trespass was evident and there was no other damage on site. There is signage on all entrances and very clear boundaries. Without installing CCTV or putting up tall, perimeter fencing, there is little else that can be done. It was felt that tall



perimeter fencing is not appropriate for the site, particularly being in an AONB, and CCTV is a costly investment, that would not necessarily prevent any trespass, and could also be intrusive for day to day use. All incidents are logged and there is minimal intrusion. We also noted that the local residents are also very vigilant.

*The school always looks welcoming and well kept.*
