Teaching by Mr Bennett

Sheriffhales Primary School

This term at Sheriffhales Mr Bennett has been working with Willow, Oak, and lime class.

Over the term Willow class have been working on Gymnastics and multi skills where we have been looking at different methods of travelling and linking them to different patch and point balances, where as in Multi Skills we have started to introduce very simple games on the attack and defence aspect of different Invasion games.

Oak class have been preparing for the gymnastics festival looking at the Key step routines, where as the 2nd half of the term we have followed the football scheme of work which helped us to win all our games at the Football festival held at Idsall.

Lime class have been improving their Netball skills hoping to improve on the fantastic 3rd place they got last year, during the 2nd half of the term we have been focusing on gymnastics where we have been creating our own sequences and exploring using different equipment.





John Wilkinson school

At John Wilkinson it has been a busy start to the school year, Mr Bennett gets the day going with "Wake up shake-up" an incentive to attract children to get to school on time.

Year 3 and 4 have been working on Football looking at passing with different parts of the foot and traveling with a partner visiting different gates. Autumn 2 has involved dodgeball, where the children have been playing with special powers, where year 4 have been working on their fitness following a very demanding circuit.

Year 5 and 6 have been working on their netball and handball skills working mainly on positional play and implementing those positions within a game situation.

For the 2nd half of the term year 5 have taken to basketball where the focus has been shielding and beating a defender, where as year 6 have been focusing on tag rugby focusing on 2v1 situations and finding spaces not faces.

Teaching by Mr Bennett

St Marys Albrighton Primary school

Mr Bennett has been making great use of the brilliant wall bars we have at our school, the children's faces as they enter the hall are a picture.

We have been looking at all different aspects of Gymnastics ranging from cannon and unison routines to linking different rolls with different balances.

The children have been able to absorb what they have taken on last year and further their knowledge producing some fantastic gymnastic skills ranging from cartwheels on the bench to handstands on the floor.

Mr Bennett has also given some training to our playground leaders and bronze ambassadors as we were away on our Residential trip which we loved!!!!!, since the training we have organised a dodgeball festival for year 3 and a multi skills carousel for year 2.







Claverley Primary school

Autumn 1 has involved gymnastics, where the focus has been Key steps gymnastics.

In red class the children have been following the key step 1 sequence in preparation for the gymnastics festival. Blue class have been creating there own 10 move sequence where they memorised and performed their performance with the help of an iPad where they were able to analyse and improve.

Hockey has been the theme for Autumn 2 where both classes have had there first introduction to the game, learning to control the ball and convert what they have learnt into a game situation.

We have participated in lots of tournaments where we finished winners of the year $\frac{3}{2}$ dodgeball.





Teaching by Mr Bennett

St Leonards Primary school

At St Leonards we have been following the get set for pe schemes of work, where Nursery have been working on the "Introduction to PE" module. Mr Bennett has been super impressed with how well the children have settled and can now find a super space.

Reception have been looking at different travelling movements and linking these movements on different pieces of equipment. Year 1 and 2 have been looking at the stages needed to perform a high-quality forward roll and have even progressed to the teddy bear roll.

Both year 5 classes have taken to netball where we have been looking at shadowing an attacker and gaining an advantage by shaking the defender by transferring their weight from one side to the other.

We have taken part in X country and sent over 50 children, we have also attended ks1 multi skills, dodgeball- where we finished 2nd and 3rd, gymnastics, and the mud run.

Castlefields Primary School

Mr bennett has been in with us this during Autumn 2 as part of the trust school triangle, He has been working with year 2, playground leaders and year 4.

Year 2 have been following gymnastics focusing on patches and points and linking them together to produce a 4 balanced sequence.

The year 4 class have been looking at invasion games with Netball being the focus working on footwork and stopping without moving.

Our playground leaders have now had their training and run regular activities at lunchtime.

We have been as busy as normal with our tournament entries where we had multiple top 10 finishers in the x country.

At St Leonards the focus has been working with Key stage 1 looking at the get set framework where the focus has been fundamentals.

Teaching by Mr Jew

Church Preen Primary School

During the Autumn term Mr Jew has been teaching R — Y6 at Church Preen Primary School. During autumn 1 KS1 covered 'Fundamentals' of PE, whilst Y3/4 and Y5/6 covered netball. This was partly to help ready pupils for the WBS High Netball League, which Church Preen participated in during autumn term 1, performing very well! During autumn 2 Mr Jew taught Net/wall activities to KS1 with Y3/4 and 5/6 covering Hockey. Mr Jew said: "KS1 pupils have really developed their understanding of how to move well and how to send and receive different objects using hands and feet and KS2 really improved their netball skills and skills and knowledge in hockey".



St Leonard's Primary School

During autumn term 1 Mr Jew taught gymnastics to all Y3 and 4 classes. From this many pupils attended the after-school gym club ran by Mr Bennett, resulting in 3 Y3/4 teams entering the Key Steps Gymnastics Competition at Idsall School in November! Y6 focussed on fitness in autumn 1, completing several fitness tests during week 1 and 6 and working on improving different components of fitness in between. During autumn 2 Mr Jew/Mrs Dunn taught dance to Y3/4 and netball to Y6. Mr Jew and Mrs Dunn also ran the 'Active in Mind' club – a national programme designed to support pupils struggling to cope in school with coping strategies learnt through physical activity.

Morville


KS3 Boys Basketball
